

Helping hands

Many old people today are virtually trapped by, if not in, their own homes. Some of them find it very difficult to manage their own affairs and they do not know how or who to ask for help.

The Homes Project, funded by Barnet Council, aims to provide advice and support on money management, energy savings and home safety and security to elderly people who are referred by community agencies, including social services, local organisations and also neighbours.

Redundancy Shock for Teachers

Teachers who work for the Multilingual and Language **Support Service (MELSS)** in Barnet are being made redundant.

MELSS staff work in partnership with schools to help children new to English and bilingual children to become more fluent in their use of the language.

Funding

Funding comes partly from central and partly from local government, but now the funding arrangements allow an increase in the devolution of central funds to schools. Most secondary school heads have decided to take the money, so the secondary sector will no longer use MELSS. About half of the primary heads also wish to employ their own language support staff. The number of posts required centrally is to be reviewed and a new structure is being developed. Schools will

be "encouraged" to recruit staff from the existing MELSS team.

A right melss

To this end, posts are to be advertised in schools by half term, which is 21 February.

Redundancy notices were served this week. As people become re-deployed either in schools, by the end of March, or elsewhere within Barnet borough, the redundancy notices will be withdrawn.

Many women, particularly those from ethnic minority groups, could be adversely affected in the future despite their long, loyal and successful service to our schools, our children and ultimately our community.

It is to be hoped that neither the children nor their teachers will be damaged by any consequences of these redundancies.

Ignorance is bliss
