To no one's surprise Ken Livingstone has been elected Mayor of London, beating the Conservative candidate, Steve Norris, on the second count. On what was a bad night for the Labour Party, Frank Dobson came third, only 20,000 votes and 1.2% ahead of Susan Kramer of the Liberal Democrats.

In the London Assembly elections Labour won six of the 14 constituencies and their total of nine seats was due to receiving three extra top-up seats from the party list. This compares with the Conservatives who won eight of the constituencies and received only one extra seat to also give them nine seats.

Assembly line

Here in East Finchley we are part of the Barnet and Camden London Assembly constituency and, even though six of the seven parliamentary seats in the constituency are held by Labour, the Assembly seat was won by the Conservatives. Brian Coleman (Con) scraped in ahead of East Finchley councillor Helen Gordon (Lab) by only 551 votes.

In the Mayoral election in the constituency Steve Norris came second with 27.7% of the vote compared with Frank Dobson's 12.8% in fourth place, behind Susan Kramer. Ken Livingstone's support at 38.8% was considerably ahead of all of them.

Green garage

On a very local note, Noel Lynch of Noel Lynch's Bargain Centre came close to being elected to the Assembly. He was fourth on the Green Party list but, unfortunately for Noel, only the first three Greens were elected to the assembly.

Low cost financial services have arrived in East Finchlev with the launch of a local credit union. **Finchley Credit Union was** launched on 13 May at East Finchley Library and is now open for business.

The event was attended by Barnet Council leader Alan Williams and Rudi Vis MP and attracted 87 new members all in one afternoon.

Community credit unions provide an opportunity for local people who have difficulty gaining access to traditional financial services and who wish to borrow or save relatively small amounts. It also benefits the local community by offering borrowing at lower rates than the high street banks and enables others to invest in the community by using it for some of their savings.

Membership of the credit union is open to anyone living in East, North and Central Finchley.

The credit union will be opening regularly at the Neighbourhood Centre, 42 Church Lane, East Finchley between 7pm and 8.30pm on Wednesday evenings and between 10am and 12 noon on Saturday.
