Advice for young people

331 Ballards Lane is the new home of Barnet's information, advice and counselling service for people between the ages of 14 and 18.

They can use it as a place to go, chill out and seek help in the areas which concern them most, such as health, including sexual health, home and housing, finance, career, gap year projects and safe travel.

Other professional advice services in these areas have taken space on the premises e.g. the Family Planning Service and Prospects, which is a career advice service. Young people will also be able to access personal counselling via a contract with Barnet Community Counselling.

Any Time

No appointments or referrals are required for any of these services.

Job sharers Judy Mace and Anne Turner, who have a wealth of experience in social work, mental, physical and sexual health and education, are managing 331. The long-term aim is that it will be fronted and partially run by the young people it is there to serve, who will work there voluntarily in return for the training they will receive.

Once the centre has accumulated a "staff" of volunteers, the hours will be extended. Currently it is open on Monday 10 am - 2 pm, Wednesday 12 - 4 pm and Friday 2 - 6 pm.

The Apthorp Fund for Young Artists is inviting Barnet artists to compete against artists in Brent, Enfield, Haringey and Harrow for a share of £17,000.

The aim of the fund is to encourage promising young artists, with work purchased displayed in hospitals, schools, residential homes and youth centres. Purchase prices range from £100 to £2000 and there will be an award of £5000 for any work that is considered outstanding.

The project is open to artists aged 18-30 who live, work or study in the five boroughs. A panel of judges including gallery owners, practising artists and a trustee of the Milly Apthorp Charitable Trust, who provide the funds, will make the final selections.
