## Michael Kreisky 1944 - 2000

The untimely death of Michael Kreisky of Eastern Road at the age of 56 came as an enormous shock to friends on The Archer.

respondent perished in an horrendous plane crash on 23 December along with his son Tom, daughter Clare and brother Brian. Tom's girlfriend Clare Gale-Hasslam was also killed.

The UK Air Accident Investigation Branch is still trying to piece together the final moments of the flight of the plane, a Beech 200 Super Kingair bound for Majorca, which crashed into a Hampshire rubber factory minutes after take-off from Blackbushe

The death of all five family members came three years after Michael's wife Gina had died from cancer. Michael and his brother Brian, a wealthy man who had made his fortune filming motorsports events of former Austrian President, Bruno Kreisky.

Michael's passion for cars - he was a rally driver with a car collection which included two Mark II Jaguars - showed in his writing for *The Archer*. Whether speculating about the sudden filling-in of potholes in Durham Road or trying to pin down the origins of a burnt out Mazda car in Huntingdon Road, Michael's love of classic cars was always obvious and he relished the glamour of
