### ARTS AND CINEMA

When you get hooked on movies, as I did at an early age (it started when my dad bought me The Film Revue Annual of 1952), you invariably have your collection of favourite stars and films. I remember

being mesmerised by the heroics of Errol Flynn and Burt Lancaster, both sadly gone to the great movie house in the sky, and having my funny bone tickled by Laurel and Hardy and Norman Wisdom.

As I progressed, I developed critical faculties and consequently my admiration focused on directors and writers. This was in the years of Billy Wilder, Howard Hawkes, John Huston and writers such as Joe Mankiewicz and Paddy Chayefsky. Later came the wave of Europeans, Truffaut, Fassbinder, Godard and Bresson.

One of the modern directors that I have a high regard for is Robert Altman. Often considered a maverick, he continually turns out interesting, unusual and often controversial films with a unique style and structure. Starting in television, he came to prominence in the seventies with the anti-war satire MASH, which made stars out of Donald Sutherland and Elliot (where is he now?) Gould. [Rumour has it that he became a father of one or two Friends - Ed.]

Why am I plugging Altman's works? Because the Phoenix is showing four of his movies on two consecutive Sundays. On 4 February The Long Goodbye and McCabe and Mrs Miller and on 11 February The Player, Altman's dig at Hollywood, and Come Back to the Five and Dime, Jimmy Dean. Following these on 18 February there is a double bill of the much-underrated Wonderboys with Michael Douglas (aka Mr Zeta Jones of Hello Magazine) coupled with Bowfinger starring Steve Martin. The remaining matinee in February is taken up with two Costa Rican movies La Veuve de St Pierre and Black Cat, White Cat, both directed by Emir Kusturita.

The main features during February are as follows: 9 February Faceless directed by Liv Ullman, assisted by Ingmar Bergman, followed by two weeks rep and, to end the month, Chocolat with Juliette Binoche.

#### February 1994:

Praise from the Guardian newspaper's diary on The Archer's first anniversary had a prominent front-page position in February 1994. Journalist David Newnham wrote, "While other titles stumble from one issue to the next, East Finchley's community newspaper goes from strength to strength."

Editor Paul Savill was snapped by the house photographer trying to adjust the décolletage of a nubile manikin in the window of the now defunct Fashion Factory (next to Maddens). The scarlet undies and model were reported to have cost £220 - a figure, which even in 1994, would have raised blood pressure of even the keenest purchaser of a Valentine's day gift. This amenity has long since been unavailable on the High Road!

Dave's flower stall, a welcome feature on the then derelict site now occupied by Amy's hardware store, was getting ready for Valentine's day with red roses selling at £2.50 a bunch. Local poet and supporter Dave featured in *The Archer* in many editions. Where is Dave now?
