## Plus ça change

178 new homes for East Finchley were to be constructed by Fairview New Homes, PLC on the redundant Lucas factory site in Oak Lane. The Lucas factory, originally built in the 1920s for the production of pianos, was used for the manufacture of diesel injectors until its closure in 1989.

The 1994 East Finchley Community Festival planned for 18 June was given a full centre page spread preview. Strawberry the Clown, the Albion Morris dancers, and Candela (pictured left), a seven piece all-female salsa band, were all lined up to entertain the 5,000 people estimated to attend. The Festival Committee spent many hours dreaming up many wheezes to raise the £4,000 fund raising target.

Also drawing in the June crowds at the Phoenix cinema was the smash hit Four Weddings and

Mozart in East Finchley

On Saturday 30 June the London Mozart Players are giving a concert at All Saints in Durham Road; it's first in the area and the opening concert of the East Finchley Arts Festival. The orchestra is Britain's longest-established chamber orchestra, formed in 1949 by the violinist Harry Blech, with a worldwide reputation for its performances and recordings.

The programme includes works by Mozart, Vivaldi, Purcell and Tchaikovsky, as well as the Oboe Concerto by local composer Geoffrey Hanson, Artistic Director of the Festival, with oboist David Theodore.

Over the last few years the LMP has established concert series in a number of outer London venues, including Chiswick, Wimbledon, Kingston and Upminster, and they hope that this concert will lead to a similar series being set up in East Finchley. These concerts are aimed very much at a local audience and are designed to be intimate and informal, with children particularly welcome. For the concert on 30 June anyone under 16 can buy a ticket for just £1. All Saints is well known for its acoustics, and is regularly used for recordings

and rehearsals as well as concerts.

#### **Lush provision**

There are two strong local connections for the LMP in East Finchley: Ian Lush, the orchestra's Managing Director, recently moved to Market Place, and Principal Cellist Sebastian Comberti is a longstanding resident of Chandos Road. Both are very enthusiastic about the prospect of regular concerts within walking distance of their homes! In the 30 June concert Sebastian Comberti is one of the two soloists in Vivaldi's virtuosic Concerto for Two Cellos and Strings, together with his desk partner Julia Desbruslais.

Ian Lush hopes that as many people as possible will support this event, so that they can be confident that a regular series would be well received. See opposite for the programme.

## For Love of Music

By Diana Cormack How many four-year-olds do you know who would turn to their mother and say, "Mummy, I love Shostakovich"? Michael Mistra did just that and now, over 30 years later, he is writing a book about the Russian composer!

His mother Anna lives in East Finchley and earlier this year she joined Michael in Paris, where they went sight seeing together. But Michael's main reason for visiting the city was to research his subject.

#### High notes

During his schooldays at St Michael's, Highgate and the City of London School, Michael played the flute and he attended exhibitions for youngsters at the Royal Academy of Music. He studied at the University of Guildford, where he began conducting and also did a teacher training course. Michael decided to go to the USA for his Master's, which he achieved in Kansas City, followed by a Doctorate in Music in Colorado. Now he is Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Edwardsville near St Louis where he teaches, conducts and researches.

Hence his visit to Paris leaving his American wife back home, though she is probably used to his trips abroad, for Michael often goes to the Czech Republic for Master Classes.

He has been invited to conduct in Bulgaria and has lectured in Glasgow on his beloved Shostakovich. Michael also manages to come to East Finchley to visit his mother from whom, she believes, he may well have inherited his love of music!
