## **Finchley Forum**

The last Finchley Forum tackled another busy schedule with issues concerning East Finchley such as a new Neighbourhood Warden Service, the deteriorating 263 bus service, graffiti nuisance, and the effects of local CPZ.

#### **NYPD East Finchley**

A new Government-granted Neighbourhood Warden Service is to assist the police. Representative Paul Lamb said, "We are one of the safest boroughs, but some pockets need to be addressed." The organisation aims to fulfil a highly visible role in community development and environmental improvements.

The wardens will not replace the police, but work on a non-interventional basis. "We are not just about hitting with a stick, we would look at a situation and work out how to approach it", Paul Lamb concluded.

The service, which starts in February, is already operating in Burnt Oak, North Finchley and Grahame Park.

#### **Slow Bus Service**

Councillor Kathy McGuirk reported that passengers have to wait for up to 80 minutes and locals wonder if it is sufficiently monitored.

Matthew Preston from London Buses, responsible for the reliability, quality and safety of the contracted private bus operators, said his company employs intense monitoring methods; undercover surveyors and a radio controlled method (Automatic Vehicle Location) are increasingly used, but training lies with the private contractors.

The 263 bus service standards have fallen mainly due to recruitment problems and will be replaced in February by Metroline with low-access double-decker vehicles.

#### **Graffiti Battles**

One resident criticised the Council's fight against graffiti. The councillor addressed budget complications and limited powers of the police. Stan Dean from Neighbourhood Management said problems are with removal itself, which can damage private property, and with tracing re-offenders due to a lack of witnesses. However the Internet can provide some information about tagged graffiti.

#### **Controlled Parking**

Bedford Road residents condemned the implementation of CPZ in their area. Like many other streets, Bedford Road has no garages or driveways and drivers are now forced to park on the High Road or elsewhere, whereas paid parking bays are hardly used.

Chris Chrysostomou from Highways promised they would look into dual parking with residential parking permissions

## Art attack

One Friday afternoon in late August local shopkeepers and shoppers on the High Road found themselves surprised by a group of youngsters busily spraying graffiti on a newsagent's shutter. No one, not even the police, stopped them. It was only when the police were shown a piece of paper by the boys that bystanders began to understand what was happening. This was not vandalism, but authorised artwork.

Mehmood Ghazanfar, the director of Pacey's Newsagents at 103 the High Road, explained to THE ARCHER that two teenagers had persistently entered the shop for the last two months to get permission to paint its shutter. He said how initially he had not shown any interest, worried about the result. But he changed his mind. "Personally, I think it's a good idea, instead of having something silly on your shutter, you can have something done properly."

Mehmood explained how

example photos of the boys' designs had encouraged him, particularly one that was made in Holloway Road. He also said he had been surprised they did not want money for materials. He just left them to it, after they had asked for written permission. The shutter, which includes the shop's name, has remained free of new graffiti so far.

Barnet Council, which has been leading a battle to clean up the streets of nuisance such as graffiti and abandoned vehicles, has so far remained unavailable to respond to the issue of artwork graffiti.
