Ripe for development?

Barnet Council is inviting tenders for the pavilion in Cherry Tree Wood. The building is situated next to the children's play area and contains changing rooms and toilets, having previously been used as a sports pavilion. It also once housed a nursery scheme that, over the years, some locals attempted to revive but to no avail.

In line with their current policy and subject to planning, the council envisages the setting up of a café as has happened in other borough parks such as Basing Hill and Sunny Hill. This would mean the closing of the kiosk by the tennis courts, which is on a short-term lease.

The pavilion, which would need a great deal of refurbishment, is available on a twenty-five-year full repairing and insuring lease.

The closing date for tenders is 3rd September; coincidentally the same day on which a review of the options available to improve services and attract more people to Barnet parks is to be debated.

No parking?

However some residents and businesses adjacent to the park have been disturbed by a rumour linking the leasing of the pavilion to Waitrose Stores with the idea that they want to set up a supermarket on the site of Park House, 16 High Road East Finchley. At present this building houses part of Barnet's Directorate of Community Services, with services for the elderly and for the disabled.

Locals are concerned that the area between the pavilion and Park House, which forms the entrance to the park opposite the tube station, might subsequently be used to make a car park for customers. The unadopted road Brompton Grove runs alongside this stretch of Cherry Tree Wood.

Barnet Council has not confirmed or denied the rumour, but customer services at Waitrose's head office told *THE ARCHER* there were no plans at all for this area at the moment. What do you think should happen to the pavilion? Send your suggestions to *THE ARCHER*.
