Life Sentence

An East Finchley man has been sentenced to life imprisonment after being found guilty of murder.

An Old Bailey jury found Kristian Maher guilty of the murder of 23-year-old Hendon man Gary Osborne by a unanimous verdict.

Police were called at approximately 2.45pm on 9 April 2001 to Grahame Park Estate, Colindale, NW9, where they found Gary Osborne lying in the street with stab wounds to his chest. He was taken to Royal London Hospital by air ambulance but died an hour later from his injuries. A post mortem gave the cause of death as stab wounds.

26-year-old Kristian Maher of Myddleton House, The Grange, was found nearby with a stab wound. He was taken by London Ambulance Service to Barnet General Hospital where he was discharged and then arrested. The victim and Maher were known to each other.

Young life wasted

After the trial Detective Inspector Carol Andrews, from the Serious Crime Group team investigating the murder, said, "The murder of Gary Osborne was a tragic waste of a young life. Today's verdict is the just end to the distressing ordeal that Gary's family have had to face."

Arson attack

On 15 February at midnight in Hamilton Road,
a 66-year-old man and
53-year-old woman were
woken by a loud bang.
On investigating they discovered the front door
cracked by fire and flames
entering the house. The
fire brigade arrived within
five minutes.

Both victims were taken to Whittington Hospital where they were detained overnight suffering from smoke inhalation injuries.

The police are treating the incident as suspicious. The fire allegedly started at the front door; a petrol can was found in a bin in the front garden and a box of matches at the front door.

Detective Sergeant A. Attwood said, "It was fortunate that the fire brigade were called so quickly. We can find no motive so far, we are not linking it to any other incidents and are keeping an open mind". Local Trader held at gunpoint

According to February Police figures, East Finchley High Road businesses have been burgled eight and robbed six times since 1 December 2001. Increasingly, customers find themselves having to ring the doorbell for attention on entering businesses. It comes as no surprise that there has been yet another attack on a business. This time with a gun.

On Thursday 28 February, at around 5 pm, two men aged about 40 and rough-looking, entered a local High Road business, where a member of staff was working alone. The victim said; "As they were coming in, they showed me a gun." She was ordered to lie down on the floor, keep quiet, and then dragged to the back of the shop, where they demanded money.

Frightening ordeal

She added that she was surprised they did not take her credit card when they went through her bag, or any of her gold jewellery. She was further taken aback by their choice of a business where cash trading is unusual. About eight minutes after entering the premises they left with only £50 in cash. Although she was not physically hurt, the incident had left the woman terrified and she was unable to return to work for two days.

The police, who were alerted immediately, arrived within ten minutes. Despite the pair's efforts to destroy evidence with a tissue, fingerprints were found. The men, one black and the other white, were described as approximately 6' tall. The white man was wearing a woolly navy-blue hat, a fleece (possibly blue), jeans and trainers. He was well-built, with a small beard.

The black man was wearing a hooded fleece and was slimmer in build.

Mobile update

Meanwhile, rumours about a mobile police station in East Finchley have been denied by the Police. Borough Commander Sue Akers explained the service would leave valuable officers inside and inactive. She commented, "We are looking actively for alternative ways to provide assurances for the public. A mobile station is just one of the options. It has been suggested to have these rotating around car parks, but no specific plan has been made for East Finchley. It is not on the agenda".
