Twelve go Climbing

for MS

Local mountaineers Rachel Sutherland and Kate Churchill are going to be amongst a party of twelve, who in January will attempt to climb the Argentinian peak "Acon Cagua", the highest outside the Himalayas, to raise money for Multiple Sclerosis charities.

Standing at 23,000ft (7km) "Acon Cagua", (which in an Inca language means "The White Sentinel") poses an enormous physiological challenge, mainly due to sub-zero temperatures (-30 degrees C), 80mph winds and a lack of oxygen. Altitude sickness can cause brain haemorrhaging, so organisational skills and specialist equipment are a survival must!

"The Real Outdoor Group" ("TROGs") are all aged between 28-43, and include an engineer, two BA pilots, a psychologist, a designer, a geneticist and an outdoor pursuit instructor. Rachel is in nursing, and Kate is one of only eleven registered female plumbers in the UK! Four of them are women and three of them have already climbed "Elberus" - Europe's highest peak. They have been planning the trip since the New Year and the bill is running into thousands....

Their boots are expensive: add seven layers of clothing, waterproofing, ropes, pickaxes and food for six weeks - not to mention camping gear. Anything that they need to not freeze, like toothpaste, they will need to sleep with,

in their sleeping bags. These have to be made-to-measure, as any gap in one too long would mean frozen feet, as well as extra weight to carry.

Endurance

They will need to acclimatize by resting for a few days, for every few thousand feet of ascent. As long as there are no signs of altitude sickness, the camp can be moved up to the next level and this process repeated up to the top! Acon Cagua currently has a 20-25% summit rate and they're not going to let it faze them. "Stamina is a forte in women", says Rachel "and older women are much better placed than younger men, to deal with these conditions." She should know. Rachel has already cycled from John O'Groats to Lands End: in 1983 she raised £8,000 for a body scanner for Charing X Hospital.

Money for art's sake

Whether you're a budding Picasso or a fledgling Damien Hirst, Barnet Council is offering a unique opportunity for North London's young artists to put themselves on the map.

The Apthorp Fund for Young Artists, now in its ninth year, helps young professional artists and those preparing to try to make a living from their talent, by purchasing selected works.

An exhibition of the work selected will tour the boroughs before being displayed permanently in public buildings.

Previous winners have found the scheme to be an important stepping stone. Not only does the cash prize enable artists to buy materials but winning is a massive confidence boost and the added exposure of exhibitions can lead to more commissions. The variety and quality of last year's submissions impressed the judges but the trustees of the fund would particularly welcome more landscape, still life and figurative work.
