Business Watch Scheme in High Road

In his fight against crime, Home Secretary David Blunkett recently pleaded, "Everyone has a part to play to assist the police with persistent offenders." Local businesses have decided to do just that and are now joining forces in a Business Watch Scheme.

Early Warning System

Twenty one traders on the High Road, predominantly independent companies, gave the idea a warm welcome after numerous criminal incidents. The scheme enables traders to take protective measures following an alert from a central source which pages all businesses within 60 seconds of an incident.

Barnet's Police Sector Inspector Maurice Hartnett said, "It's about sharing information concerning shoplifting and other nuisance crime." According to Inspector Hartnett, most boroughs in London and elsewhere in the UK have similar setups, and Golders Green's has already proved successful.

A growing problem

One local business owner, who has been "steamed" six times this year, says the problem, with mainly schoolchildren, started a year ago. "Maybe [the criminals] have been shoved out of other areas, and decided to come where the resistance is low. Before that time we just had the odd problem. When you are on your own, you can't do much but confront them, especially when they disperse into different aisles." The trader, who regrets he might be sending the wrong message to innocent children, said, "You are also limited in what you can say before you have a problem with the law".

Another trader said of one mugging, "It was one of the most terrifying experiences I have ever had in my entire life. They were like a pack of dogs; I have never felt more intimidated."

Neighbourhood spirit

Superintendent Simon O'Brien of Colindale, who was involved with one of the first schemes in Covent Garden, said, "The strength lies with the community itself. Through the scheme, everybody gets to know each other and it toughens the neighbourhood spirit." He suggested that key influential people, councillors, local MPs, and politicians, should be involved in the debate.

The scheme sets each trader back about £2 a week, but "The average shop must lose £2 on stolen goods a week anyway," said a local trader. "Hopefully the criminals will get wise to the fact that there is a business watch," he concluded.



In the Dark.....Again!

At 16:57 on Monday 14 January, the second power cut in six weeks hit the centre of East Finchley. The electric mains were off for some 45 minutes in the High Road, from Kitchener Road on the west side and the east side just up from Lincoln Road, down to just past the traffic lights, with some adjacent roads also affected.

Being the start of the rush hour, traffic at the cross roads was quite heavy, but, despite a few close calls, there were no actual collisions; indeed, it appeared as though the traffic was flowing more quickly than usual. Of course, pedestrians had to take more than the usual risks to cross at this point.

Many shops and businesses were forced to close during the power outage, and an automatic fire alarm mistook the situation for a real fire and called the fire brigade, who turned out in force by the shops in Viceroy Parade; there was no fire! At this point while this article was being written, just before 18:00, the electric mains went off again, and stayed off until 00:30; again, the following morning just before 11:00, the power went off for two and a half hours. There was a fleet of electricity company vans parked near the local sub-station, but only time will tell if they have fixed the problem.
