Growing Pains

Planned extensions and developments at Bishop Douglass School are giving concern to its neighbours.

Manor Park Road Residents' Association told *THE ARCHER* that, while agreeing that school facilities need improving, they are worried about the commercial aspects. Development plans include a fitness centre, and a focus on weekend activities.

With only 50 extra spaces planned for the extended car park, residents of Hamilton Road and Manor Park Road fear that the traffic in their already congested area will be "almost unbearable".

Lack of consultation

They are also worried about the potential increase in

late night/early morning functions. "I can take three or four a year," said one resident, "But there will probably be many more than that."

He and his neighbours are disturbed about the lack of consultation. As reported in last month's *ARCHER*, they say that they were not given adequate notice of the development by Barnet, and that green space and trees close to their homes have been demolished ahead of planning permission. They are now waiting for the relevant Council planning meeting to make their protest in person.

Local Planning Applications

National Hospital for Neurology, Great North Road, N2:
Demolition of the main hospital building in the Hampstead Garden Suburb conservation area, behind the White Lion public house.

5 Lincoln Parade, Lincoln Road:
Conversion of ground floor to office and provision of three self contained flats at first floor level.

The Bungalow, Cherry Tree Wood:
Erection of a new two-storey detached dwelling house with two off-street car parking spaces following demolition of existing dwelling house.

62 Fortis Green, N2:
Demolition of existing double garage and erection of a new single storey garage building with front dormer window and storage area in roof.

Erection of new free-standing, non-illuminated London Borough of Barnet signage and sponsorship panel at the following places:
Pavement on both sides of the road opposite to 20 High Road, N2.
Pavement on both sides of the road next to 222 and 197, High Road, N2.
Pavement on both sides of the road next to 58 and 57, Fortis Green, N2.
Pavement next to 1 and 2 Cherry Tree Hill, Great North Road, N2.
Outside 15 Fortis Green, N2.
