## Child in fatal scooter collision

Police are appealing for witnesses after an 8-year-old  
boy on a motorised scooter died following a collision  
with a car in the High Road, North Finchley on Tuesday,  
15 June.

At around 5pm the boy,  
named as Jamil Gormley of  
Finchley, was travelling in the  
carriageway of the High Road  
near the junction with Addington  
Drive when he was in collision  
with a bronze/orange coloured  
Fiat Bravo car.

The Helicopter Emergency  
Medical Service landed took  
the boy to the Royal London  
Hospital. He was later

transferred to Great Ormond  
Street Hospital where he was  
pronounced dead at 12.40am.

The driver of the car was  
reported to be shocked but  
unhurt.

## Clean-up hotline

You can call the clean-up hotline to request emergency  
street cleaning, and to find out dates for scheduled block  
cleansing.

Barnet say that reported  
cases of street litter, overflowing  
bins, fly-tipping, abandoned  
cars, graffiti, broken  
pavements, potholes, and falls  
of leaves or snow will now be  
dealt with immediately.

Block cleansing is sched-  
uled to take place twice as  
often as previously, with East  
Finchley due for its next deep  
clean on 16, 17, 18, 19 and

20 August. The three-month  
schedule, with details of indi-  
vidual streets, is published  
online at www.barnet.gov.uk.  
You can also call the hotline  
for details.

- 5pm, Monday to Friday. Out  
of these hours, messages can  
be left for attention on the next  
working day.

## Protection against violence

Households suffering  
threats, intimidation or  
harassment, or actual  
domestic violence can  
seek practical assistance  
from the Barnet Sanctu-  
ary Project.

The Project will supply  
safety equipment such as  
extra locks, solid core doors,  
frame strengtheners, mortise  
bolts, door viewers, window  
locks, security grilles, smoke  
alarms and panic alarms, and  
can arrange direct communica-  
tion with the police. Provision  
is according to the needs of  
each individual household.

The aim is to maintain  
threatened people in their  
own homes, so avoiding phys-  
ical and emotional disruption.  
Councillor Brian Salinger says  
that this will also save Barnet  
over £300,000 pa, as last year  
120 families were made home-  
less following domestic vio-  
lence. However, nobody will  
be forced to remain at home  
against his or her will.

The Sanctuary Project,  
financed jointly by Barnet  
and central government, is a  
joint venture by the police,  
the Domestic Violence Sup-  
port Service and the Barnet  
Safer Communities Partner-  
ship. For further information,
