I spoke to Daphne Chamberlain, who thought they were more likely to be starlings. Daphne says that blackbirds live in pairs in their own territories, while starlings gather in flocks. She also thinks that starlings can imitate other birds' songs, and I know that there are several very vocal blackbirds in and around East End Road.

I've seen this group of birds twice now, as I had to go past the nursery again. They were in the same place at the same time (about 2-2.15pm). I'd love to know if anyone else has seen them. If they are starlings, it'll be great to know that we have them living with us here in East Finchley.

Fanfare for flower bed

Having won an Awards for All lottery grant to fund a commemorative flower bed on Willifield Green for Hampstead Garden Suburb's centenary, the HGS Horticultural Society was proud to see the flower bed win two awards recently.

In October members were presented with a bronze medal and certificate by the London Gardens Society for 'a garden display in a public place' and in November they collected third prize in a similar category from the Mayor of Barnet in 'Barnet in Bloom' competition.

The flower bed itself has now had a winter makeover. The summer carpet bedding and Suburb Centenary commemorative lettering have been removed, having turned black in the first frosts of the season, and have been replaced with fresh turf under-planted by hundreds of spring bulbs. The society wants to continue giving pleasure to the local community by taking care of the flower bed at its own expense at least until May 2009, when the flower bed will take centre stage once again for the society's 100th birthday celebrations.

Volunteers needed for dementia research

An appeal in THE ARCHER for volunteers to help with research into new tests to determine dementia caught my eye. Having seen my late mother undergo such testing, I offered to take part.

The sessions are held at the National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery in Queens Square, near Russell Square or Holborn tube stations. They take place on a one to one basis in a small office and do not involve anything intrusive.

Establishing norms

The purpose of the study is to gather information from healthy individuals over 50 and includes word retrieval (naming items from their picture or from a description), conceptual knowledge (answering factual questions) and perception (detecting the position of objects relative to one another).

The results will be used to establish how volunteers perform in these tests and to examine how factors such as age and years of education influence their scores. Understanding how healthy people manage will help with evaluating whether the performance of those who suffer from neurological disease, such as dementia or stroke victims, is normal or below what might be expected for someone of their age.

The actual procedure involves answering simple spoken questions and completing paper and pencil tests. These

increase in difficulty and some are subject to timing. They range from naming a set of objects to answering a series of questions about people, places, geography, words and everyday general knowledge, to identifying the location of pictures, dots and shapes relative to one another. On my second visit another set of similar tests was followed by a brain scan.

Any information collected about volunteers during the study is kept strictly confidential and will be held for at least five years in case more research is needed. The results will be used to improve further medical and scientific research.
