

Chandos Road development given green light Anew building, on the site of Robertson (previously Joslin)

Memorials on the corner of the High Road and Chandos Road, will be a three-storey apartment block containing eight flats and a commercial unit for offices.

At a packed planning meeting at Hendon Town Hall on 13 June, dozens of Chandos Road residents and representatives of the adjoining Martin Primary School vented their frustration about the development, citing concerns about over-development, parking and overlooking.

 $Developer\,G\,\&\,\bar{M}\,Simpson\,\&\,V\,Goldstein\,has\,agreed\,to\,remove$ a second-floor balcony and to brick up windows overlooking the school playground but no concessions were made about the size of the development.

Councillors voted by four votes to three in favour of the development going ahead subject to a Section 106 order which will see the developer make a contribution of over £51,000 to the borough, including £37,000 for educational facilities and £11,000 for health care.

Chris Price, Governor of Martin Primary School, who spoke at the meeting on behalf of the school, said: "It was a very disappointing result especially for the residents of Chandos Road who will have a very large development on what is actually quite a small piece of land."

Novelist in his 90s

A local man has recently become a debut novelist ... at the age of 92. He is Anthony Tobias, of Aylmer Road, who has written short stories and plays for over 60 years.

His novel, a post-Cold War thriller called Finders Keepers Killers, is based on real-life events that happened in London in the early 1990s, involving two Armenian criminals who were recruited by the Russian secret service to murder two ambassadors from the breakaway republic of Chechnya.

Anthony was working for a criminal solicitor's practice at the time. "One of the murderers of the Chechen ambassadors was being defended by us," he explains. "I went to the prison to interview him several times and bring him books and newspapers."

The man was subsequently found dead in his prison cell. "The circumstances were bizarre," Anthony recalls. "An inquest found he committed sui-
