## GP surgery: closure notice goes up

It is the news that patients of a local GP surgery have been dreading. The proposed closure of the family practice at 91 High Road, first reported in *THE ARCHER* last September, is to go ahead.

A notice on the front door and a letter sent to patients state that the practice, run by the retiring Dr Isaacson and his partners Dr Knock and Dr Mulkis, will close on 31 March. The GPs intend to transfer patient lists to their practice in Colney Hatch Lane, Muswell Hill.

### Concerns about access

Some patients say they have been left devastated by the decision that will, for many, end a relationship with the surgery spanning 30 years. They are wondering how they will get to the new practice and fear the closure will have a detrimental effect on their care.

One mother with a young baby said: "At present the surgery is a ten-minute walk from where I live. The move means that I will have to walk 50 minutes there and 50 minutes back. By public transport it would probably take just as long on two buses on a big loop via Fortis Green and cost a lot in fares.

"In reality I'd have to take a half day off work to go to the doctor. They're also running an appointment system instead of the much-loved current walk-in. How do they expect me to do that with a very poorly or feverish baby? And for the elderly and disabled, the very people who most need an accessible GP, it's even worse."

### Reasons unclear

There are fears that the closure will lengthen patient queues locally as people find themselves forced into switching to other GPs or the NHS walk-in centre at Finchley Memorial Hospital in North Finchley.

So why is the practice closing? Some patients have told us that the lease on the current

building is coming to an end and that the remaining two doctors have to find ways of managing an increased workload. However, the manager at the High Road practice declined to comment to *THE ARCHER* on the reasons for the closure.
