



# Final word on the future of our library

So what is going to happen to our libraries? Barnet Council have broken their silence following the long campaign to save them. The big changeover is set for 1 April next year. Rumours and speculation are over. Drop into East Finchley Library from 6pm to 8pm on Wednesday 9 November to find out exactly what is proposed for us.

## Alterations and reductions

This is one of the information sessions planned for every library, with the aim of seeing proposals and providing feedback before planning applications. From this we can deduce that most of the proposals will be about alterations to the buildings. This is particularly relevant to us, as our building is listed.

Barnet Council say they are keeping all 14 libraries open, and retaining their sites. They also say there will be two brand-new sites, though no details are provided in the statement. However, they will all be reduced in size, and will have fewer staffed opening hours. An overall increase in

opening hours will be achieved by running the controversial computer-operated sessions, pioneered at Edgware, in 10 branches.

We can expect commercial use of buildings, and widespread use of volunteers. Timelines of building works and details of associated temporary closures will be available in each information session.

Home, mobile and digital services will all be retained.

# Family fayre at Nazareth House

On Saturday 10 December from 2-5pm there will be a Winter Bazaar at Nazareth House in East End Road. The whole family is welcome to come along and enjoy music, teas and cakes, games for children, a tombola and raffle with stalls selling bric-a-brac, good quality clothes, cakes and a book stall.

Nazareth House is a well-established residential home to 84 elderly residents. It is run by not-for-profit Nazareth Care Charitable Trust and is open to all faiths.

In order to keep fees to a minimum, there are very few funds to provide extras and luxuries for residents, many of

whom are wholly dependent on state funding, such as outings, entertainments and treats.

The Winter Bazaar is therefore being hosted by the Friends of Nazareth House, a voluntary group which raises funds for the benefit of residents. Entry is £1 for adults, children free.
