Amaranta needs help to achieve her Australian dream

A 14-year-old girl from a Muswell Hill gymnastics club could become one of the youngest ever selected to represent England in the Commonwealth Games. Amaranta Chavez has been asked to trial for selection in rhythmic gymnastics at the Games, which are to take place on the Gold Coast in Australia in April.

a financially challenged background and the elite training that could help her fulfil her dream of reaching the Games is hugely expensive, as are her competition, costume and travel costs.

New fund supports

But Amaranta comes from past few years. Founder Jessica Shenton described the teenager as a spectacular gymnast with an exceptional talent.

Now the club is taking the next step by making a film for a crowdfunding campaign and setting up a fund to help Amaranta continue her training and meet the cost of international competitions, hopefully giving her the chance to represent England in Australia.

Currently she receives help from the British Gymnastics Hardship Fund and a grant from a local trust fund, but these only account for a small part of the thousands of pounds needed.

Library entry problems as user numbers fall away

Readers continue to report problems with gaining entry to East Finchley Library using the new personal identity system during unstaffed hours. Those who turn up without first registering often find no help or information and user numbers are reported to have fallen dramatically.

Staff who don't help ...

Brian Ingram, of Brookland Rise, NW11, told us: "My wife and I, with library cards in our hands, were rebuffed by the security guard who eventually came to the closed door and told us we could not enter until we had registered. My wife felt he was more about stopping people entering than helping. He has obviously not been briefed properly.

The Archer asked Barnet Council if all staff had received training in the new procedure, and whether there was a problem with the card-scanning

machines. The reply was: "Yes, all library staff received training. As the new technology has been bedded in we have experienced some issues. These have been quickly resolved and during this transition period we have had staff on hand to assist."

At the same time, we have also had comments from people who have found the staff helpful and polite.

The council told us there will be library staff available during unstaffed hours until the New Year.
