Bogus workmen

We would like to make you aware there are bogus roofers in the area. One of our residents has given £4,900 to a 'company' who have at best done £700 worth of work. This has yet to be verified; the resident could end up paying more money if the work is sub-standard.

An elderly couple had £1,400 in cash stolen from their home by males posing as water board workers and a vulnerable lady had £65 stolen from her flat after letting in a male who said he was checking her water.

Please do pass these warnings on to elderly neighbours as they are generally the ones targeted.

One way

A police operation was carried out by SNT officers as there had been complaints of motorists entering the one-way street Market Place, N2, from East End Road. One person was warned. Please don't let this 'short cut' cost you £100 and three points on your licence.

Moped thefts

Unfortunately the thefts of mopeds across London continue, with East Finchley having seven stolen in April. Four stolen mopeds have been recovered in East Finchley, three locally stolen and one from Essex.

Stolen mopeds are used to mount pavements and steal mobile phones out of people's hands; we have had nine thefts of phones in this way in April on the High Road, Fortis Green and several side roads. If you are using your phone on the street try to not advertise it and be aware of your surroundings.

Bike thefts

We have also had six pedal cycles stolen; one was a very expensive bike. Look out for the regular bike marking and security events at East Finchley station in the first week of each month. Do bring all your cycles and keep them busy.
