Sam smashes his way to top

Congratulations to Sam Gabriel who, along with five other children, competed in the English Schools National Championship U11s, representing Coldfall Primary School in Muswell Hill. Sam won his London North qualification round to reach the finals which took place in Wolverhampton on 29 April. Sam played extremely well, winning one match and losing to the tournament finalist.

Sam, who is in year 4, only began playing table tennis a year ago. He played his first ranking under-11 tournament in November aged eight and by March this year was ranked 28th among all under-10s in the country. His next challenge will be representing Coldfall Primary in the Jack Petchey Table Tennis Foundation London schools finals on 10 June.

Sam said: "I really enjoyed playing in the tournament even though most of the children were two years older than me. The good thing is that I'll still be able

to play in the Under 11s for the next two years, so I'm looking forward to going back there and competing again next year."

Coldfall Primary School has invested in three outdoor and four indoor table tennis tables and headteacher Evelyn Davies said the results had been phenomenal. She said: "Our after school club is fully subscribed and the children are always brimming with enthusiasm for the sport. It has engaged so many pupils who have previously never picked up a racquet or bat."
