Stencils

A main concern for us all in East Finchley is the prevention and detection of crime using mopeds to steal phones. A very low-tech initiative across the borough will be to keep folk mindful and aware of their surroundings when using their phones. Stencils will be applied to footpaths where these crimes most occur. In East Finchley these will be initially by the tube station, Fortis Green, and by bus stops on the High Road.

Ward officers PC John Kenny and PC Phil Scottow located a stash of four stolen mopeds on the ward in September, thereby preventing multiple crimes and anti-social behaviour.

Forensic tagging

Operation Venice is the Met's response to scooter theft and scooter enabled crime. The Met is trialling the use of 'forensic tagging' spray to help identify suspects and scooters involved in crime.

Forensic tagging spray is a uniquely coded water-like substance, containing a fluorescent dye that glows blue under a UV light. The spray is discharged from a hand-held canister onto the suspect, and the vehicle they are riding.

Suspects, vehicles, clothing and property found with marks on them can be analysed to determine the time, date, location and circumstances when the spray was discharged.

Drones

The Metropolitan Police has begun an eight-week trial of an unmanned aerial vehicle or drone to support its policing operations. It will be available to officers dealing with incidents where air support would be of use, such as high risk missing people, serious traffic collisions, searches for suspects, weapon sweeps and identification of cannabis factories.



Shock at lead poisoning risk in drinking water

A couple are urging Barnet Homes to take action after making the shock discovery that drinking water was being fed into their flat in East Finchley through lead pipes that were outlawed in the 1970s.

Tahir Bhimji and Rahimah Ibrahim stumbled across the pipes during building works at their ground-floor threebedroom flat in Elmshurst Crescent, N2, and they suspect that hundreds of their neighbours on the estate could be affected in the same way.

Cumulative effect of lead

The couple have lived in their flat for 10 years and immediately raised the risk of lead poisoning with their freeholder landlord Barnet Homes. Tahir said they were told their pipes were not a high priority.

Tahir told us: "When we raised the issue we were told there's a backlog of these things but lead pipes were banned in new homes more than 40 years ago. Elmshurst Crescent was built 50-60 years ago, before the ban, but they should have got round to sorting it out by now.

"We'd like to start a family but we are worried about the risk of lead poisoning. When the inspector came round he was visibly alarmed at seeing lead pipes. A survey found lead levels were within legal limits but no one has any idea of the cumulative effect. It's very worrying."

Tahir and Rahimah are private owners but pay a £160 service charge each month to Barnet Homes on top of the council tax they pay to Barnet Council.
